

- **Preserving the lake's private status**, standing firm against those who seek to profit at the expense of our founders' legacy and the best interests of current lake families.
- **Strengthening leadership capacity**, by leveraging the expertise among our members and continuing to support and empower our dedicated staff.
- **Building stronger ties with the broader Ringgold County community**, through outreach, education, and service.
- **Reinforcing our financial foundation**, so we can develop the amenities needed to keep our community current and enhance property values.

We have the vision—and the personal and professional expertise—to accomplish all this and more. Once the invasive species threat is behind us, we can focus on additional priorities like restoring on-water fuel services in a way that avoids pollution, preserving the Rural Improvement Zone (RIZ) statute for long-term water security, and effectively countering any legislative threats instigated by detractors. In the future, we can look to further adding to our employed staff.

Beyond these goals, we should consider further initiatives that enhance our environment and community character—such as a tree-planting program, a native grassland initiative and efforts to rehabilitate neglected or derelict properties in and around the lake community.

The founders and original lot owners of this community had a bold vision for the future. Now, it is our turn to carry that vision forward.



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WOW, summer has flown by and with the beautiful fall colors, sporting events and all that fall has to offer, it's time to start thinking about getting ready for winter which includes your sewer system. As reported in our spring article, the check-valve failure issue is still top of mind. In July we met with the e/One National Field Service Manager to discuss the ongoing check-valve issues, the measures we have already taken and what more can be done to further reduce check-valve failures. Since this meeting we have installed monitors on select e/One systems that have had multiple failures. e/One will be monitoring these systems and will provide a report in September with recommendations to further reduce check-valve failure rates. We will be sending out a communication once we receive the report from e/One.

The district has sent out several communications regarding the Myers Septic System upgrade, and the installation of Uni-Lateral Valves. If you have a Myers Septic System, please update it. If you don't have a Uni-Lateral Valve Installed, please have one installed. The Uni-Lateral Valve will protect your home and the lake from sewage main back-up should your e/One check-valve or sewer discharge line fail.

If you missed our "Beyond the Flush" meeting on July 26th, we talked about what the future holds for the Sanitary District. To recap we discussed being financially sound, future maintenance and repair costs, population growth of the lake, contractor availability, and most importantly staffing issues. As many of you know our Superintendent, Dion Giles, is on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year! He has 540+ residential sewer systems, Frontier, Bunker and West Lift Stations, 30+ miles of sewer main and 4 sewage lagoons to take care of. Most days he is Superman! Much of the \$20 monthly rate increase will fund hiring an extra employee to manage the workload. We are pleased to announce Logan Connolly as our new Assistant Superintendent. Logan started his new career with the district on August 4th. Please join us in wishing Logan all the best!!

The Sun Valley Sanitary District will only send out communications that are important, we will never send out junk emails. When we do send out emails a good number of them come back blocked. PLEASE do not block our communication. We are asking everyone to **check your email settings and un-block us**. You can also find most information on our website at www.sv-sd.com.

Most homes have an e/One lift station in their yard. Each lift station has an audible alarm and flashing red light to notify homeowners of e/One pump failure or the need for service. **Please do not ignore the alarm or warning light.** If you see or hear the alarms, smell sewer, or see sewage at any lift station, please call our service line immediately at 641-234-2099.

REMEMBER ONLY HUMAN WASTE GOES IN THE SEWER SYSTEM. Among the items that should NEVER be flushed or put into the sewer drain include but are not limited to the following items: Female Hygiene Products (Tampons, Applicators or Pads), baby diapers, flushable or non-flushable wipes, disposable dish rags/towels, non-biodegradable products, paints, solvents, and more. If you're not sure, call before you flush it or dump it down the drain!

Once again, a big thank you to our employees Dion Giles and Carrie Christiansen and our volunteer Board of Trustees! They work tirelessly to keep our district working, our lake safe, and protecting your investment!



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Fishing and Water Quality Update

The Fishing and Water Quality Committee continues to try to make SVL the best possible for ALL members.

Thanks to Darla Turner and all who volunteered to help with the Kids' Tournament. This was another great success for all. We will have a Fish Fry Social event on Sept. 20 at the clubhouse. That weekend was chosen because Iowa State Football is idle and Iowa Football is away to Rutgers on 9/19. The Fall Largemouth Bass Tournament is on Sept. 27 with a premeeting on Sept. 26. Entry forms and rules are on the website, in the clubhouse, and in this publication. Thanks to Jeff Morse for being Tournament Director.

We continue to measure water quality monthly; this is supported by RIZ. This has been challenging due to the early summer flooding. E

Coli levels were up at the west end only over July 4th but now are normal throughout the lake. The rest of our water quality parameters are all in the normal range as well.

There have been a few requests for additional lake maps and SD cards. If anyone is interested in a poster print, laminated map, or SD card map, please contact the office to get on the list. This order will be placed by early fall. We are unfortunately only able to produce Lowrance compatible SD cards due to proprietary issues with other vendors.

The Fish Shocking Survey done by Aquatic Control on April 23, 2025, continues to show stunted Largemouth Bass due to overpopulation of this species resulting in a negative impact on all other species. The Walleyes in our lake are also all low weight for length. Aquatic Control recommends harvest of an additional 5000 Largemouth Bass per year for the next few years, harvest of Black Crappie, continued replacement of habitat with synthetic and woody structures, fall stocking of RedEar and Walleye, and a repeat survey in 2028. The full survey results are on the website for those who would like to read it.

Signage for control of Invasive Species has been developed and posted. The RIZ Board and Jon Vennink were very helpful with the J-20 boat wash and signage. The outdoor wash stall is now set at 140 degrees to help control invasive species, especially Zebra Mussels. There is growing concern about the destructive nature of these species in bodies of water.



A group of us met with the DNR leadership in Des Moines to discuss several issues which was very productive. They were impressed with all that we are doing regarding lake management. We will continue to work with them on fish management and limits to meet the needs of our Fishery. More specific details will come in the next issue of this publication.

A final thought about anonymous posts on social media. These posts can be very disruptive and time-consuming for lake association staff, volunteer committees and board members. A number of phone calls have been received about the post by an anonymous member after the anonymous member claimed they were stopped on the road by the DNR and fined for excess fish possession. First, after investigating this claim with the DNR, we find no evidence that this event ever occurred or that any fine was ever issued. Second, if a member has a concern with any issue, we would hope that they would identify themselves so that a constructive dialogue could occur. Any concern can be voiced in a public or private manner with the appropriate committee, management, or the board. The goal of the lake community as a team should be to have concerns voiced and then addressed and respectfully resolved. A constructive process is difficult with anonymity.

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SUN VALLEY LAKE BASS TOURNAMENT RULES FOR Sept 27, 2025



1. **DATE AND TIMES:** On Sept 27, 2025: The tournament hours are from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. All boats must be checked in prior to launching. Check in will begin at 6:00 am at the beach house boat ramp. Boat launch will begin at 7:00 am. Boats will be launched in numerical order as determined by boat draw the night before. Boats late to check in will launch after the last boat drawn. Tournament director and staff reserve the right to change launch time at their discretion based on safety or other conditions. Weigh-in time is 3:00 pm at the beach house boat ramp.
2. **ENTRY FEES:** \$60.00 per boat (2 participants per boat, only). Includes Biggest Bass Contest entry fee of \$10 per boat. Entries accepted until Sept 26, 2025, at 5:00 pm, only. Entries after 5:00 pm on Sept 26, 2025, may not be accepted.
3. **ELIGIBILITY:** Boat operators who are Sun Valley Lake property owners, 16 years of age or older with paid entry fee and a boat with a properly operating live-well and 2025 SVILA boat stickers and lot numbers attached. Partners: No age limitation. If partner is a SVILA property owner, they must be in good standing with SVILA.
4. **SAFETY & SPORTSMANSHIP:** Good sportsman-like fishing practices and safe boating must be observed at all times. Life jackets and kill switches (if equipped) shall be worn during take-off and while the boat engine is running. There will be no alcoholic beverages consumed by contestants during tournament hours. SVILA safe boating rules apply.
5. **FISHING LOCATIONS:** Anywhere on Sun Valley Lake.
6. **CULLING:** Immediate culling of fish is allowed. Having possession of more than 5 fish per boat shall be grounds for immediate disqualification.
7. **TACKLE & EQUIPMENT:** Only one fishing rod and reel may be used at a time per fisherman. All bass must be caught by casting only. Only artificial bait or lures may be used. Trolling as a method of fishing is prohibited. No umbrella rigs allowed.
8. **SCORING:** Only largemouth bass will be counted. Total bag weight per team will determine placement. All fish presented at weigh-in must measure at least 15", mouth closed, tail compressed. Teams presenting fish which are determined to be "short" shall be penalized the weight of the short fish. Teams presenting more than the tournament limit shall be disqualified. Dead fish presented at weigh in will receive a 0.25-pound reduction per fish. If it is the big bass, the penalty will also be applied to that fish. Dead fish may not be culled. Any frozen or iced fish presented for weigh-in will result in immediate disqualification.
9. **PROTEST:** All protests must be submitted in writing and signed within 15 minutes after the weigh-in is completed. Director must be notified of any protest before close of scales. An official written protest must be presented to director within 15 minutes of completed weigh-ins. A "protest committee" consisting of 3 fellow anglers, randomly drawn by tournament director, will address all protests.
10. **LATE PENALTY:** Any boat checking in after 3:00 p.m. will lose one pound per minute up to 10 minutes, then the boat shall be disqualified.
11. **TIES:** All ties will be determined by the weight of the largest bass of each boat's 5 fish limit.
12. **NO REFUNDS:** Unless cancellation of tournament-by-Tournament Committee.
13. **TOURNAMENT MEETING:** There will be a ***non-mandatory*** Tournament meeting Friday night, Sept 26, 2025, at 7:00 p.m., at the **SVILA Club House**. Boat numbers will be drawn for each boat for the tournament "Start." If you don't attend the meeting, you will be assigned a late "Start" number by the Tournament Committee.
14. **PRIZES:** Pay out based upon entry fees paid less any administration expenses. **Heaviest bag limit per boat:** Payout will follow schedule based on number of boats entered. One spot will be paid per five boats entered. **Biggest bass contest:** 1st place--60% of big bass "\$10" fees; 2nd place-- 40%.

NOTE: The Tournament Director shall have sole authority to interpret these rules and to apply them to all issues, disputes, questions, or controversies concerning the tournament. All decisions made by the Tournament Director concerning the interpretation or application of the rules or award of the prizes shall be final and not subject to dispute or appeal.

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
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
